

## **NISE AWARDS 2023**

### **PRESENTATION OF THE AWARD**

The NISE Award is an international scientific honor given to researchers in the humanities and social sciences. It is awarded bi-annually by NISE and ADVN to authors of, alternatively, PhD and Master thesis's that contribute to a deeper historical understanding of nationalism and nationalist movements in Europe from the XVIII century onwards.

The main objective of the NISE Award is to encourage the comparative, transnational and interdisciplinary study of nationalism and national movements in Europe by recognizing a distinguished academic achievement in publishing original and relevant research about this matter.

In 2023 the prize will be awarded to the best PhD Thesis.

### **PRIZE**

1000 EUR

### **REQUIREMENTS OF THE RESEARCH**

- Successfully defended PhD thesis.
- The thesis must have been successfully defended maximum three years prior to its final submission for the prize.
- It should analyze subjects related to:
  - nationalism studies
  - theories of nationalism
  - comparative or transnational analysis of national movements and/or intermediary structures
- A summary of the thesis, in English, of 3000 to 3500 words, should also be submitted.
- Each author can only submit one thesis.

### **COMPOSITION OF THE JURY**

The members of NISE's Scientific Core Group (SCG) compose the jury. The jury decides on the value of the submitted works in a multi-stage assessment process, and judges secretly and autonomously on the notion of 'original and relevant research' and on the award of the prize.
